

[Champions for the Brokenhearted Life Without Limbs Nick Vujicic Ministries]

Hi everyone. I'm Nick Vujicic, and I'm so grateful that you decided to join me today for Champions for the Brokenhearted.

To all our donors and everyone who prays for us, thank you so much for all your support and all your prayers.

We are so grateful for you and how you have partnered with God to help us accomplish everything we do in the name of Jesus, and I want to invite everyone watching to also join our Circle of Champions where you can be a part of what God is doing through this ministry and also receive monthly bonus content from our talk show.

This month, January, we are talking about human trafficking, an issue that is far too prevalent right within the borders of our own country. It is my honor and privilege to invite back to the show, but having now a one-on-one time, my amazing, amazing brother in Christ—all the glory goes to Him—humble, obedient, amazing brother and Board Member of Life Without Limbs, Jaco Booyens, for our second interview here for the Champions for the Brokenhearted, talking about this very, very—I'm going to call it—important topic, but really it's a tragedy right now, and it's only getting worse. We talked about this very same topic last year, and it hasn't gotten any better.

Please make sure you continue to keep our nation in prayer. This is something you need to watch. So, sit down, and let's engage together and learn more about human trafficking here. Real quick, an introduction to Jaco. He has become a trusted voice in the anti-sex trafficking community, and he's actively engaged in the fight to combat trafficking in the US and globally. He is a world-renowned international speaker and presenter, and is actively involved in legislation reform. He is a key advisor to several nations and organizations combating human trafficking and works with law enforcement and over 170 non-profit organizations in 56 countries. He's just about to go and address every single Attorney General counsel happening here shortly.

Actually, he's jumping on a on a flight soon. His efforts include awareness and prevention, training, consulting, leadership, rescue, and rehabilitation through his non-profit organizations. Jaco, without further ado—I love you man.

Jaco>> Thank you, Nick. Love you, too.

Nick>> God bless you! Yeah,

Jaco>> God bless you!

Nick>> It's amazing to have you back.

Yaco>> Yes, thank you so much. Honored to be with you.

Nick>> How are you?

Jaco>> Doing well.

Nick>> Doing good, 2023.

Jaco>> We say God is good, you know, but truly honestly, He is! He is! He is! Nick, he cares about the one.

Nick>> You know, Jaco, I admire you on so many levels.

People like ourselves, who, we say candidly, "We know too much." We know too much, not to do something. We know too much not to say something. We know too much. and we know that time is short. For you, in the wisdom of how God has really given you also a mind of a unified effort that crosses over multiple organizations' efforts, there's no boundaries to this effort because this topic, human trafficking, affects so many different verticals from government to social to church to media, and it goes really deep down. For someone in America who doesn't know--

I don't know the recent stats. You know the recent stats. Last January in 2022 we found out, and we publicly announced that in Texas, where we now live, human trafficking went up 400 percent in America. Can we first start with America and just the current status of where we're at, as best as you can, to someone who knows that human trafficking is real.

We know about maybe 5-10 years ago people thought, "Oh, no, there's no human trafficking." Now we know in America. We are thankful for churches like Mercy Culture, all the organizations, the 36 safe homes that you're Board of, as well and Church 1132 and Gateway Church and some good churches, great organizations, but, man, we've got a tragedy right now. Help us understand that there actually is a—it's a travesty.

Jaco>> Yeah. Nick, thank you. We are increasing about the same pace, so we are 300+% above where we were a year ago, almost to the date, right, and we're in that and we can break it down, month-to-month, week-to-week, day-to-day, but we're about to eclipse that. We're about to see a radical shift because I think culturally, yes, we know culturally. Now I remember the days in 2012 where there was no legislation, and in 2015 we actually got legislation specifically to protect the minor against sex trafficking, and we mean at the point of arrest and in the court of law that some of the cases not adjudicated as a prostitution case but that this actual law, right, and I remember those days.

We're now eclipsing a time where America unfortunately—and this is why I'm so glad about you're doing this show—America's going, "Oh, we know human trafficking. We know it," but they don't, and complacency will once again set in, like I believe the church has become comfortably numb, so we're getting comfortable talking about human trafficking, and in a way it's good because people go, "Okay it's real," but it's now almost second nature to just throw out the word "human trafficking" to where actually action's not going to follow it, so it's just becoming part of culture, and evil will wedge in there, and go, "Let's normalize it," and that's what you're seeing happening. You're getting good American citizens being co-opted into changing language and changing culture to normalize some of these behaviors and perpetuate it.

So I actually believe we're about at the pinnacle of a rapid increase of trafficking in this country because the resistance. I say this, Nick, our country's been taken through a stress test over the last 12 months from this perspective, the sexualization of children, right? And we're failing the stress test.

Evil is testing the stress level, saying, "When will they push back. Let's push a little more." It's like a balloon, right, when will it pop? And we keep giving, and we keep giving, and we keep giving, right? And so, that is a danger sign when you start talking about drag shows for kids and the masses are not showing up—2-3-4 protesters who are Christians show up at a drag show for kids.

We're failing the stress test. We are not showing up, saying, "Absolutely not!" Absolutely, we're no longer going to be the #1 nation on Earth, sexualizing children, the #1 human trafficking nation on Earth, commercializing sex with children, and because we're failing the stress test in one hand, and the other hand, it's becoming nuanced. It's social talk, sex trafficking, as if they know.

Meanwhile, they're complicit, so you've got people now saying, "Oh that's terrible! Human trafficking is terrible!" not even knowing they're complicit. That's dangerous! That is a danger territory that I'm afraid we're about to enter into, and then evil will just say, "If you're going to leave space, we'll take it." Right? So, not good.

Nick>> You know I love that line, "If you leave space, we'll take it." Man, I wish Christians...I wish Christians embraced that.

Jaco>> ...would want to occupy.

Nick>> To occupy.

Jaco>> But we don't have that mentality in the church, though, Nick. It's not trained. We don't train our young men that God made you a hunter. Nick Vujicic. How is Nick going to hunt? Nick is a hunter. God made you. If you're a man, and you know men and women, there's nothing in between. You're a hunter. Well, if you're not hunting for your food today, and I know you do at times, but if you don't hunt for your food, then what is the American male supposed to do as a man of God?

You hunt injustice. You hunt for the broken, for the broken. It's search and rescue. You go find them. You find those who are corrupting society and you point it out, and you bring you justice. Right? We're not hunting evil. No. It's hunting our children. So the church needs to train some huntsman.

Nick>> Yes, Amen. Amen.

Jaco, it was quite some time ago that your eyes were opened to human trafficking on a personal level. Tell us how that happened and how God led you to the ministry that you're in today.

Jaco>> In 1994 I was 18--that's 28 years ago. My sister was trafficked for 6 years. Now, we don't—we didn't know that it was trafficking while it was happening. So you have a sister and you go through that. You learn about that after the fact, immigrated to the US, so it took me about 8 years to really comprehend what my sister is telling me men had done, and on the hands of people who were friends, right? To realize, wait a second! This is human trafficking. This is sexual exploitation, and I'll never forget—Nick, I don't talk about this often, but I was driving in Chattanooga, Tennessee, and I stopped at a red light, downtown Chattanooga. They've got a place called Lookout Mountain, right?

And I saw a scene across the street at a 7-Eleven gas station. In the scene I saw I was like, “Well, that's what my sister told me they would do to her, and so I witnessed for the first time in the US around 2003-2004, this scene that was a human trafficking scene.

I was like, “Wait a minute! No way!” because we're from South Africa. No way children are being sold in the US. I mean this is the land of the free and the home of the brave. Surely not here, right? Well, come to find, #1 place on Earth, right? And so that was an awakening, and in that moment God just spoke, and then spoke also through my wife Philippa, and said, “Use what's in your hands,” and I just kept hearing this phrase by God saying, “Not another one.” So it's not--this is a surrender to God, and it's, I've got to say, “Yes, yes, Lord we're going to keep going, you know, for everyone. Nick?? Amen. The short film “8 Days” --Tell us about that.

Jaco>> "8 Days" was birthed--you know we wrote this short film. It's so funny, Philippa, my wife, was a writer, and you know Philippa well. Philippa came and said, “Nobody is speaking about trafficking from the victim's perspective, so we never hear the victim's thoughts. We never look through the victim's eyes. We always hear it from law enforcement, so “8 Days” is written from Amber, the victim, and you hear her thoughts. You see through her eyes. The camera moves that way. It was written as a short film, but once we started filming, we kept filming, and it ended up being a featured film, right? And that film, God asked me—off-camera, I spoke to you about it—God asked me, “Will you give this as first fruit?” and I said, “Lord, what does that mean?” He said, “I want to use this film to raise funds for anti-trafficking organizations around the world to bring awareness.”

And by God's grace, Nick, honestly that little movie is seen by over 100 million people in over 200 countries, and it's become a training tool to really train everything from youth groups to law enforcement to say, “Hey, these are the tactics. It was divine. I mean God moved on this set in ways that, you know, so unplanned.

Nick>> Wow!

Jaco>> Everything was completely unplanned.

Nick>> Jaco, you have many irons in the fire and definitely you know how powerful media is to connect the heart and the mind to move, just like you're saying, there are a lot of people who we already know there's 25,000 people dying today because of starvation and when we feel like

it's so far away, but woe to us who get numb in what is happening in our own backyard. Many less excuses--still it's no excuse to the church with the poverty in the world, but this enslavement of children in America in our own backyard, to change the mind, to awaken the church, to talk about it, but also do something, get engaged somehow, be educated in how to move the needle in our own community. Media is powerful and you're working on a media piece "Borders to Bridges."

You've been on the border countless times.

I went to the border a couple times, and the stories as I talked to border patrol and people there and Board of Supervisors on the county board, where you got Yuma, California right there as well. Texas, obviously, it's the largest part of the border, and you go there often. Tell us what you see on the border and tell us more about "Borders to Bridges."

Jaco>> We prayed about "Borders to Bridges" because we know this. You know, we know so much, Nick, and then when you know, now you're accountable to God. You've got to do something with it, so we asked God, "What does it look like when you bring the heart of Christ into a crisis?" What would it have looked like if not to be controversial, but if we truly brought the heart of Christ into the riots of 2020-2021. If we truly say, "Well, where is God in the conversation?" And so we're bringing that conversation to the border, Nick, to really serve the local community, but here's what we're seeing. We're seeing again a body of Christ in the US that is being told, "You have to be compassionate. You have to love," and yes, we have to love, but there has to be:

God is a God of order, so what you're finding right now is people are being coerced, which is an element of trafficking: Coercion, forced fraud coercion. They've been coerced in Guatemala, Honduras, Cuba, Venezuela, coerced to say goodbye to a family member, normally a child, send this child on a trek with a promise that if they arrive in the US it's all taken care of, and it couldn't be further from the truth. So now what we're finding is we are displacing people that had never been homeless in their life, Nick. I'm talking about a lawyer interviewing with me the other day who's now living on the street with her three and four-year-old in El Paso, Texas at nine degrees, sleeping homeless and never been homeless in her life, and saying, "But this is not what we were told our condition would be." So we as the church now have to ask ourselves a question, "Are we standing idly by when a government or authorities, people placed in positions of power, possibly by God to do the right thing, for the sake of being politically correct, allowing people to walk from a bad situation into a very worse situation because, unfortunately, human nature is you're going to get hungry.

Yeah, you want to be fed and clothed and you want to be warm, and unfortunately nefarious characters move in when people are displaced, and they have no means. Sex will always, not often, ALWAYS enter the conversation. They will always revert to sex because I believe sex is the most dangerous weapon on Earth in the hands of Satan, and there is a means to eat by being sold or to sell your children. Yeah and so this is what we're seeing, but it's happening and when

people understand, it's happening in the US, so not only are we dealing with American children being trafficked, we've got a catastrophe in our CPS system. Absolute disaster! Disaster!

We're now looking at CPS facilities where maybe 1 out of 240 kids have not been sexually abused, not--and I have a whistleblower on camera talking about this. So, we've got this massive crisis with our own children in this country, the foster-care system. Where's the church? The hungry? Where's the church? The trafficked? Where's the church? Now we're displacing this mass body of people with a false hope that we will take care of them, and we're having a hard time taking care of our own, and they come, right?

And, of course, once people are here, we need to feed, clothe, but the resources are not there. The facilities are not there, and so now we're seeing people falling in the hands of traffickers, and the traffickers call these kids "ghost children." That's their term for them because no one will look for them. There's no record of this child. No one knows this child, a naked kid.

I don't know how deep you want me to go, but it gets so, you know, I'm sitting on the border about a month and a half ago, and I'm kneeling on a grave, okay.

And it's a shallow grave. It's only two and a half feet deep because it was dug that 40 minutes to dig the grave and it's a child that's buried, and I'm not talking about one--100s of children are being buried on the Texas border with no autopsy done. Don't know who the child is. The plaque on the cross which was PVC pipe which now someone paid to actually replace the PVC pipe with metal crosses, the plaque says, "Baby John Doe." Don't know. His or her parents may not know the child's deceased, and you're sitting here, and the reality hits you in the face like, "Wait a minute! This is not God. This is not how we deal. This is not..."

There's another way to deal with this crisis and at some point God just hit me and he goes, "Jaco, "Borders to Bridges," and I pulled 27 scriptures out of the Bible that references borders, culture honoring culture, honoring law, but yet built bridges of compassion. Build bridges of ministry, build bridges of discipleship, build bridges of ministry and missions. Yes, there has to be law and order, but then go to the people where they are and bless them, and let the businessmen in America go to Guatemala and say, "Let's incubate small business." Don't disfranchise this father and send him or this child, and then, yes, when they are here, take care of them, but definitely not lie to them, Nick, honestly, for political gain, and I blame all parties, all parties.

This is a God's heart issue that, according to me, is lacking in that conversation regarding trafficking, for sure, and then the border.

Nick>> Jaco, they're saying that right now in America the numbers are around over 500,000 children being human trafficked, at any given time, only one percent are being reported. Help us understand, first of all, the disconnect in—we're talking government responsibility—stewardship of what this really looks like as a country legislatively to change this. Obviously, you need the law, even if it is reported. Obviously, 99 are not reported. Help us understand that unless there is legislation reform and new laws and closing up of the border and other things that maybe you

might say, "What is it going to have to happen in our country where we actually see a decrease along the way to absolutely abolishing this?"

Obviously, there's steps. There's laws. There's execution. There's management. There's a cohort of a unified front and voice, but you can't do-- I mean, it would be great right now if we could get every single denomination right now to tell 10 percent of their pews to go down to the border and let's just go! Get in your RV and bring food and we're going on a mission's trip, and it's called South Texas, and you go down there with supplies and when you run out, you come back, and we refill you, and go back again. That would be almost a last effort if nothing changes and we're already 400 percent growth last year to now, then another 300 percent.

if this doesn't slow down. I mean that's our last effort. I mean if we don't do that, it's then on us if the watchmen don't say anything, then it's on us. The blood is on our hands. These children are on our hands, so God forbid it comes to that, that the government doesn't do something. Help us understand where the government can now come into this, and what does it take right now. What do we need for America to do legislatively-- Texas to legislative do--to actually stop this?

Jaco>> Yeah, that's the conversation, and thank you for being brave enough to ask that question, Nick, but that's your character, your nature. I want to skin this, this way, and let you know. God was a family before He spoke this Earth into existence.

You had a Father and a Son and a Holy Spirit communicating, but He was a family. It's always going to come back to family, ALWAYS. Every single crisis we can chalk off the board here today: hunger, homelessness, trafficking—it's always going to get back to God's original design. Adam and Eve, they were a family, right? Satan came into subdivide, so ultimately this answer ends up in family, but I want to go full circle. We have really good laws on the books against human trafficking. They're not enforced, so now you have to go in and say to the District Attorneys in the very city you're sitting in, will not take a case that's a human trafficking case and adjudicated according to the law of human trafficking.

They'll plead it down to a misdemeanor in it, arms trafficking, contraband content, kidnapping even, because all those are lesser charges, right, but not human trafficking. Why? A human trafficking case takes time, serious investment, especially when a child is involved, right, to win. District Attorneys grow in their political careers with victories, so they want to chalk up short victories, quick victories, quick settlement, out of court. Very, very seldom there's a human trafficking case of an American child to go in front of a jury of peers. When it does, like in Fort Worth recently, the perpetrator gets 30 years in prison, but it happens very seldomly, so the laws that are on the books have to be valued a little more than toilet paper, I say. It can't just be flushed. They actually have to adjudicate it, right, #1. So, let's elect people in the District Attorney jobs and the judges that actually understand God's heart and will adjudicate.

Now new laws: We recently passed the law in Oklahoma called "House Bill 3702," which God wrote through me, and this is a bill to remove pornography out of all curriculum of all Oklahoma students' curriculum, and we're now taking that law across 13 states. So now, Nick, we're looking

at having to write laws to get porn out of school. We're looking at writing laws how to have city ordinances where you can't have a drag show for kids. Why do we have to do that? It's preposterous that we have to write a law to say pornography shouldn't be in school. We're having to do that because the believer is not standing up.

Nick>> It's crazy.

Jaco>> They're not there. So now you have to write all these laws and then, hopefully, enforce this law, right?

We could go all the way into every single city that should have an Anti-Human Trafficking Task Force in their Police Department, but do you know those were the first divisions cut under the defunded police movement was the child special units?

Nick>> Wow!

Jaco>> Dallas lost its Vice Unit.

Nick>> Wow!

Jaco>> First thing cut under defund, and people don't know this, so for all the people that were so "Defund the police," the second you do that, the lowest hanging fruit gets cut, so it's the smallest team, so the three-man, anti-human trafficking team--gone! We have over 30 states in our country where there's not an Anti-Trafficking Task Force. In the Attorney General's office I'm meeting with 30 AGs in a week. So, there's so much work to be done that if you look at it broad, you would go, "This is impossible!" so you must distill it back down to wherever God placed you. For the viewer, wherever you live, God ordained that your ZIP code is your zip code, and you are to take dominion.

Nick>> Today is heavy. Today, this quote: "The only thing necessary for evil to triumph is for good men to do nothing." It's ironic that it takes a limbless evangelist to tell the church we're crippled. Jaco, if someone's trafficking someone, tell them. Look into that camera. Speak to that person who's actually involved. They're being coerced. They're in their school. They're already targeted who they're going to be targeting in the 2023 second semester of school. Talk to the people, first, that are actually trafficking these people.

Jaco>> I'll say to that individual, for any individual who is forcing somebody to do something outside of their will, defrauding (meaning lying to them, or coercing, and bribing them to do it), if that's you, we know that you also have been exploited. We know that over 80 percent of you have never talked about you being abused.

We know that you need help. We know that Satan took something that happened to you and twisted it and made you believe that that is love. That is how you get power. That is how you get attention. So, I'm going to ask you to speak up and ask for help. The one hurting those broken—  
**HURT PEOPLE HURT PEOPLE.**

That's a fact, so for those of you hurting other people, and you are hurting them by asking a girlfriend to send you a naked picture, you are exploiting her. You're breaking trust. You're breaking her value system. You're making her do something that God did not intend for her to do, which means, as hard as it is, you are partnering with Satan, and that produces death, and that will never fill the hole that's in your soul.

That will never heal the brokenness in your past, but there is healing for you. There is a way for you to be redeemed. There is a way for you to literally go from being a soul who is killing Christians, hurting them, to a Paul who says yes to God, to write most of the New Testament.

Your story can look very different, and for those of you who are being abused, the lie that you're being told by the one hurting you that no one will believe you, no one will understand, that your situation is unique, that you deserve it, that they will harm your family, that they will kill somebody, that they will expose you in the public, that the whole world would know—all of those are lies from the pit of hell, no different than the lie that Satan told Eve in the Garden.

People will listen to you. They will understand. There is help. They will rally around you. They will protect you. Your family will be safe. You can, in fact, today, this moment, when you see this, pick up the phone, make a phone call to our organization or the closest trusted adult, and speak.

God says, “The truth will set you free!”

Whatever Satan can keep dark in your life will consume you and ultimately destroy you. You must bring it into the light, and, yes, that may mean you must talk about those who are hurting you, but think of it this way: If you don't, not only do you not get help, but you leave them in the hands of Satan. See when you, actually, the victim, talk about the person that's hurting you, you're actually giving them an opportunity to find help. Sure, that may be in prison, but they're going to get an opportunity to repent and come to Christ. Ultimately, that's our heart, so for Nick, for those who are being hurt today, there is help.

We know the tactics of Satan. We understand how he works, but we must first as American men in this country ask ourselves, knowing the statistics, the profile of the person buying sex in America, okay--over 90 percent is a male, ok? It is normally a male who's a father of two, married, that earns at least a median income.

It's not who people think, and this is why they can hide in plain sight. This is why there are secrets. We have a Catholic church brother. I've, maybe you have, I've never heard of the Catholic church asking for help outside of the Catholic church, ever! I received a letter a confidential letter in the mail two days ago of the Catholic church with diocese very high, at Bishop level saying, “Will you help us? We have lost control over our children.”

There's a shift happening. It is in the church. This demonic act is in your church. It's in your school. For the woman who has been raped and victimized 30 years ago and never said a word, this is the moment, this taping where you say, “I need help!” because God sent His Son to die on

the cross for that transgression, to heal that heart to say, "That's mine to take! It's not yours to carry." How about we set you free from that? How about we restore your marriage and your relationships? How about you get trust again? How about you can love unconditionally again?

Nick>> I want you to know there is healing for you, and if you've been raped and abused and you've been broken, we're here for the brokenhearted. Jesus came for you. He is our refuge and this is His hand extending to you saying, "Trust me. Talk to someone, and trust Me!" We're going to give you information with who to reach out to.

Jaco, lastly, someone's being trafficked and watching this. We want you to know that we're not naïve, that you actually watching this, could be someone who's like, "Actually, I am being trafficked, and I don't even know how I even got this video, but I'm watching it right now." Give some encouragement to that person, right now, who's being trafficked, and what they can do, right now.

Jaco>> I want to tell you a very, very brief story. I meet a girl named Rebecca. Rebecca's rescued from human trafficking seven years, and the second I meet Rebecca, God says to me this. He says, "Jaco, tell her I was there. God is with you," and you could say, "How could He allow that to happen?" Man chooses to hurt you, but God is with you?" If you reach out, He is not far off. He has not abandoned you. He can restore you. You can trust certain people, so in this moment be smart, be safe, but speak up.

Ask for help. I promise you, freedom could be minutes away, so I pray that God gives you the courage in the moment, when you see an opportunity to ask for help, that you do it, that you just do it. The day my sister was rescued to her own testimony, Nick, this is 6 years, she said this to herself and to God, "Today I fight. Today I ask for help, even if it means I lose my life," and that's the day she was rescued, and she looked me in the eye, not more than a month ago, and she said, "If I only made that commitment to myself and to God a year into trafficking, three months into trafficking." So, it's going to take courage, but lean not on your own understanding. Lean on Christ. Let him be your Rock in this moment to give you the courage to follow through and just ask for help.

Nick>> Let's pray, in Jesus' name, we thank you, Lord, for those watching. We thank you, Lord, that you would, right now, comfort that person who's watching, who's trafficked. Give them the courage to stand up and fight with wisdom. Lord, we pray that you would send a rescuer in Jesus' name. God, we pray, right now, for someone who is coercing someone, or is actively engaging, enslaving someone else. In Jesus' name, I pray, right now, for that person, and I pray, God, that You would give them nothing but a sense of Your love and calling to say, "Come back!" no matter how deep and dark and far you've run. Just come back. I've got My arms open wide. You don't need to hurt anymore in the inside and do this to never address the hurt. Come and be fully healed and set free no matter the cost.

Fight! Fight to find Jesus. Fight to find freedom from your slavery, and Satan we speak to you and your hordes of demons and every spiritual, demonic activity that even can hear my voice,

right now. In Jesus' name, you're nothing. Your days are numbered, and we cast you, right now, out of any person, and in the atmosphere of what's going on, we pray for an atmospheric change, right now, by the power of the Holy Spirit, in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, that right now, Lord God, right now, You would do a work, right now, in that place, in that person, even to the pimp or whatever's going on right there, right now.

Father, we pray, God, that you would even help someone cry for the very first time to feel for the very first time, after so long. Lord God, we thank you that you hear our screams, that we cannot even utter in Jesus' name. We pray for liberty. We pray for freedom. We pray, God, right now, for bondages, right now, to break in Jesus' name.

Father, we pray lastly for the church. Oh Lord, forgive us! O Lord, forgive us if this is something that You need to allow, to right now get into the forefront of our mind, as a church, of all things to wake us up before it is too late. Father it is already calculated at this point that it's at least a generation lost at this point, maybe two, but Lord with faith, we beg of You. We beg of You. We beg of You, break our hearts! Crush us! Take all of our cash!

Take away from us what we've put as gods before You that we may come back to our senses and, on our knees.
